Social Media Goal-Setting Can Reap Great Rewards

In the vast world of social media, gaining follows, likes, and subscribers can seem like a daunting task. But fear not, fellow Grangers! With a few easy adjustments to your social media pages, you can rake in the followers and likes and spread the message about your Grange activities far and wide.

The first thing you should do when goal-setting for your social media pages is analyze your current content. Ask yourself the following questions:

- Does your page have different types of posts? (Examples include news, daterelated content such as holiday greetings, celebratory content such as welcoming a new member, quotes that help others learn about the organization's values, re-shared content from sources that provide information to your audience such as scholarship deadlines, legislative initiatives of the National Grange and more)
- How much of the content on your page was made by YOU and not just shared?
- Around what times do you see the most interactions with your page? (You can learn more about this if you are an administrator by going to your Page's Settings and looking for the word Insights or Analytics. Different platforms have different routes to get to the page analytics, so you may have to Google how to learn about your Page's followers or get page insights.)

After taking time to reflect upon what your social media pages have to offer, take some time to make goals. It is important to set realistic goals. You will not gain 10,000 followers, overnight but setting a goal of getting 100 new likes for your page is very reasonable and something you can do by inviting your friends and community members to your page. You don't have to do this alone. Ask your followers to invite their friends to like your page.

Other goals should include creating a cohesive page, posting regularly, and mixing up your types of posts. A cohesive page will have similar brand colors of the Grange and be appealing to the

eye. When posting for your page about 60% of your posts should be made by you, the other 40% can be things you shared from the National Grange, other Granges, other organizations in your community or affecting your followers, or interesting ideas you want your members to engage in.

Dedicating just ten minutes a day to your social media pages can do wonders for your local profile. Don't forget, if you will be unable to post for several days, on most platforms you can schedule posts in advance. See more about this in a future issue.

USDA's Farm Service Agency is currently accepting new and modified CFAP 2 applications

Has your operation been directly impacted by the coronavirus pandemic? USDA is implementing updates to the Coronavirus Food Assistance Program (CFAP) for producers of agricultural commodities marketed in 2020 who faced market disruptions due to COVID-19. U.S. Secretary of Agriculture Tom Vilsack announced an expansion of CFAP on March 24, 2021. This is part of a larger effort to reach a greater share of farming operations and improve USDA pandemic assistance.

In 2020, did you own/produce any of the following?

- Livestock (cattle, pigs, sheep/wool, broilers/pullets, eggs and more)
- Row or specialty crops (including aquaculture, nursery, and more)

If so, you may be eligible for financial assistance through CFAP 2. The CFAP 2 signup period has reopened as part of USDA's new Pandemic Assistance for Producers initiative. Note: Participation in CFAP 1 is NOT required for assistance through CFAP 2.

EVENT REGISTRATION

The registration fee, made payable to Grange Revival, covers five dinners (Tuesday through Saturday; leftovers may be available for other meals), an event food tray, t-shirt and admission for most workshops (some excursions or workshops may have a small fee for admission, materials or transportation and will be announced in advance). Registration fee is 50% refundable if canceled at least one week in advance of start of event; fee is non-refundable if canceled less than one-week prior to the start of the event.

GETTING TO GRANGE REVIVAL

You can drive, fly or take a bus to Grange Revival. The closest airport and bus terminals are both located in Rapid City, about a half hour drive from the campground. We will have a transportation coordinator who can assist with getting you to and from Rapid City with advanced notice. Please contact event organizers to make transportation arrangements.

If you are renting a car for the event, we encourage you to explore savings through your Grange member benefit discount with Hertz and other car rental places. You may also find discounts on flights and other lodging you can use on your way to Grange Revival and on the newest partnership with Harvest Hosts for Grange members who own RVs. Log into your nationalgrange.org account (or sign up) and learn more.



ACCOMMODATIONS

Make your reservation today directly with Days End Campground to ensure your preferred accommodations. Call KK at (918) 327-9529 and tell her you're coming to Grange Revival.

All rates are based on 2 people per cabin/site. Additional people staying in each site are \$2/ night for anyone 5 or older (pre-Juniors are free) for RV and tent sites. Pre-Juniors are free in cabins, Junior Grangers are \$4/night and Grange Youth or older are \$8/night.



There is a 9% hospitality tax, as noted for each night.

If you wish to extend your stay, rates will apply for up to four days before (July 16) and two days after (July 27) our event. Check-in and check-out time is noon.



The campgrounds has a ramp to offload ATVs and motorcycles if you wish to bring them.

Pets, friendly and on a leash with well-behaved owners who will clean up after them, are welcome.





If you prefer to stay in a hotel, there are three within a short distance of the campground (Days Inn, Super

8 and Baymont Inn & Suites).

No room blocks have been established and there is no group/ event discounted rate. These hotels will not takes reservation until sometime in 2020. Contact the hotel directly.
