




#### **GRANGE SPIRIT WEEK IDEAS - DAY 7**

#### **MEET YOUR CA ST GRANGE LECTURER - SUZANNE DAVIS**

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

My name is Suzanne Davis and I am excited to be your new California State Grange Lecturer. I wanted to take this opportunity to introduce myself to everyone and tell you a little about myself. I feel that it is important to know your leadership and make sure that you feel comfortable enough to reach out with questions or suggestions. We are all Brothers and Sisters of the Grange and that makes us family! My family consists of myself, my husband and our three children ranging from 22-27.

My home Grange is the Ono Grange #445 located in beautiful Ono, CA. It is in Northern California about 20-25 minutes West of I-5 depending on how much of a lead foot you have on your drive. We lost our Grange Hall in September of 2020 to the Zogg Fire and are in the laborious and challenging process of re-building. We are resilient and will persevere in bringing a Grange Hall back to the area. I became a member of the Ono Grange #445 in 2015 when we returned from living in Oklahoma for a number of years. I didn't even know what the Grange was at that time but my husband encouraged me to attend a meeting. He knew what it was about as he was born and raised in Ono. Then Aunt Mary (my husband's aunt) spoke up and said "Don't you think we ought to make her a member of the Grange before we start putting her in charge of anything?" That is how I became a member of the Ono Grange.

After a couple of years our Lecturer needed to resign and I saw an opportunity to become a bigger part of the Grange and do more. I have been the Lecturer of the Ono Grange #445 for 5, maybe 6 years now and I enjoy it very much. Learning about our history and traditions and being able to share that information with other members is important to me. Being Lecturer isn't just about presenting information to the membership. It is about engaging your members young and old, getting them excited about upcoming events on the local, regional, state and national level, presenting a bigger picture of what the Grange has to offer them and how they are an integral part of making their community a better place.
