 - 1. The State Grange is a "delegate" body comprised of Masters and their spouses or alternates from each subordinate community Grange in the State of California. Meeting once each year, we propose resolutions to establish policies on statewide and national issues. These may require legislative advocacy to enhance the rights of agricultural communities, rural families, educational programs and other community concerns. Our first annual meeting was held in June of 2015 and will be held each year. The annual meeting is conducted by the officers of this Grange.
 - 2. This State Grange will provide leadership training to the directors and others involved in our various programs which include Junior Grange (ages 5-14), the Grange Youth Fair program, Grange Women's Activities and Community Service programs. This is ongoing and year-round. These will be conducted by various appointed directors and/or the officers of this Grange.
 - 3. As a "reorganized" State Grange, we plan to work with the subordinate units in this state to assist them in compliance with the Rules of the Order, the National Grange Digest of Laws and the regulations of the Grange. This will be led by the officers and appointed Deputy Masters of this Grange.
 - 4. Dues collected by this Grange from each subordinate Grange is split with the National Grange as required to receive support in our fraternal programs and allow us to use the Grange name and logo which are trademarked by the National Grange.
 - 5. All activities will be conducted by members who desire to further the "general purposes of the Order" which include advancing the cause of education which begins with the family circle, promoting family values, aiding rural communities through forums and educational workshops and through legislative action to protect the small farmer.
 - 6. This State Grange is a State level chartered unit of the National Grange Order of Patrons of Husbandry. We are in the process of re-acquiring the property and assets of the former California State Grange through legal action. All subordinate or local community Granges in California are under our jurisdiction.
